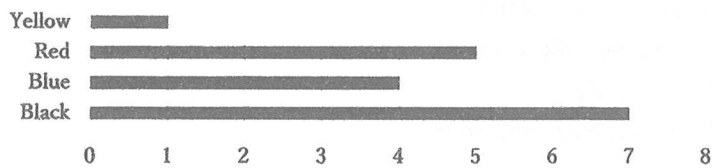

The Inventor

Driving a car can be dangerous. In 2022, there were three hundred thousand road accidents in Japan. However, the number of people who are hurt in such accidents is much less, and the reason for this is that people in cars must wear seat belts.

Everything that helps us in life has been invented by someone. Not just seat belts, of course, but cars themselves, medicines, lightbulbs, and even the pencil you write with. Usually, we never take time to think about who made these things for the first time. We call such people inventors. The inventor is the person who thinks of an idea for something new, designs it, makes it, and then changes it again and again until it is right. Nils Bohlin was the inventor of the modern seatbelt. In 1958, he was working for the Volvo car company in Sweden. He knew that every year many people lost their lives or were injured in accidents, and he decided to try to solve this problem. Before, there were very simple seatbelts, but most people did not trust them and so they did not use them. Nils Bohlin designed a seatbelt in three parts that kept the driver's or passenger's body in the seat safely. This was much safer than before, and soon many car companies started to use his design. Then, the laws in many countries changed so that people in cars and other types of *transport had to wear these seatbelts.

In his lifetime, Nils Bohlin won many prizes for this seatbelt design. But more importantly, since it was first made, his invention has saved millions of lives in countries around the world. In the United States alone, the Highway Safety Authority says that seatbelts save about 15,000 lives every year.

Please take a moment to say thank you to the inventors. Usually, we do not think about who first designed and made the things in our daily lives. Very few of them become famous. However, in offices, factories, and *laboratories worldwide, people like Nils Bohlin continue to work hard to make our lives safer and better.
