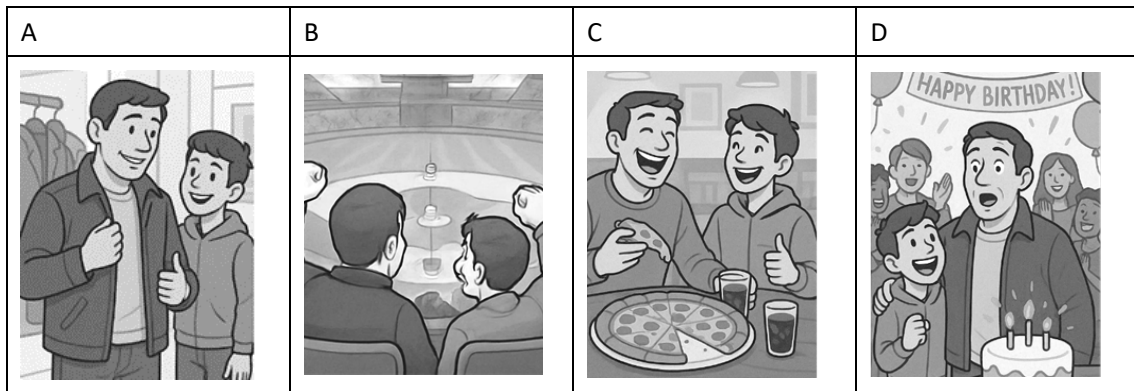

Cherry Blossoms and International Friendship

Cherry blossoms have deep meaning for Japanese people. They show both beauty and how short life is. Each spring, they bloom for a short time, and people can stop and think about life. But cherry blossoms are not only important in Japan; they have also become a symbol of peace and friendship around the world.

In 1912, Japan gave 3,000 cherry trees to Washington, D.C. as a gift of friendship. The trees were planted in the center of the city, and each spring their blossoms fill the streets with color. Their flowers are celebrated in the National Cherry Blossom Festival, and it has become a symbol of friendship between Japan and the United States. Even during difficult times, such as World War II, the trees remained. After the war, they showed a *renewed friendship between the two countries.

Cherry blossoms have also become a symbol of peace in Germany. The Berlin Wall fell in 1989, and a year later, East and West Germany became one country. Then, people in Japan collected money to give cherry trees to the city of Berlin. More than 9,000 trees were planted at the site of the wall. A place that divided people in the past now has beautiful trees that show the power of love and peace. They also show the starting of a new Germany.

These international gifts show how something as simple as a flower can carry deep meaning. From Washington, D.C. to Berlin, cherry blossoms have become more than just beautiful trees. The next time you see cherry blossoms, don't only think about how pretty they are; remember that they are a living sign of peace, friendship, and hope that connects people around the world.
